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MIRALAX COLONOSCOPY PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS

 STOP all: aspirin, aspirin-containing products, NSAIDs (i.e. Motrin, Advil, Ibuprofen, Naprosyn, Aleve), iron-containing medications including multi-vitamins, and blood thinners (i.e. Plavix, Coumadin, Eliquis, Xarelto, Ginkgo biloba, etc.) <u>5 days prior</u> to the procedure. Acetaminophen (i.e. Tylenol) is acceptable.

Hold Diabetes medications the morning of the procedure if you have diabetes **Hold Semaglutide medications like Ozempic, Mounjaro, Wegovy, Zepbound, Trulicity, etc for at least 1 week prior to procedure (typically this will be holding 1 dose)**

- 2. AVOID raw vegetables, corn, nuts, foods containing seeds, and black pepper beginning <u>5</u> <u>days prior</u> to the procedure.
- 3. PURCHASE:
 a) 1 bottle of Glycolax/Miralax (255 grams)
 b) 6 Dulcolax laxative tablets
 c) 1 64 oz. Bottle of Gatorade NOT red or purple.
 (Can substitute Crystal Light for Gatorade for Diabetics)
- 4. **<u>2 DAYS PRIOR</u>** to the procedure, you can have a regular meal for breakfast and lunch. For *dinner*, start on clear liquids ONLY.

Clear liquids include: water and/or tea, juice (including apple), broth, chicken bouillon, Sprite or 7-UP, Gatorade (Not red or purple), Jell-O (Not red or purple), Popsicles (Not red or purple). NO milk products.

At 7pm, take 2 Dulcolax tablets with 8 oz. of a clear liquid.

5. **ONE DAY PRIOR** to procedure: refrigerate Gatorade. Continue to have clear liquids for the entire day. *No solid food allowed*.

At 8am, take 2 Dulcolax tablets with 8 oz. of a clear liquid

At 12pm noon, take 2 Dulcolax tablets with 8 oz. of a clear liquid.

COLONOSCOPY PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS cont'd

At 3 pm, mix the entire bottle of Glycolax/Miralax with 64 oz. of Gatorade. Stir until dissolved.

Drink one 8 oz. glass of Gatorade solution **every 15 minutes** until the entire 64 oz. is done. Can space out drinking if beginning to feel full or nauseated.

*Continue to drink as much clear liquids to avoid dehydration.

6. <u>Day of procedure</u>. You may take prescribed medications (except for those listed above under 1.) with a small sip of water.
Otherwise, <u>no</u> liquids or food are allowed for **at least 6 hours** prior to the procedure.

Bring inhalers to the procedure, if you use them.

Please arrange for a reliable adult to drive you to and from the procedure.

OPERATING A VEHICLE or any other machinery is PROHIBITED for at least 2 hours after the procedure because of the effects of the medications used for sedation.
